I pray this finds each of you doing well. Happy Mother's Day to all the beautiful women of our church.

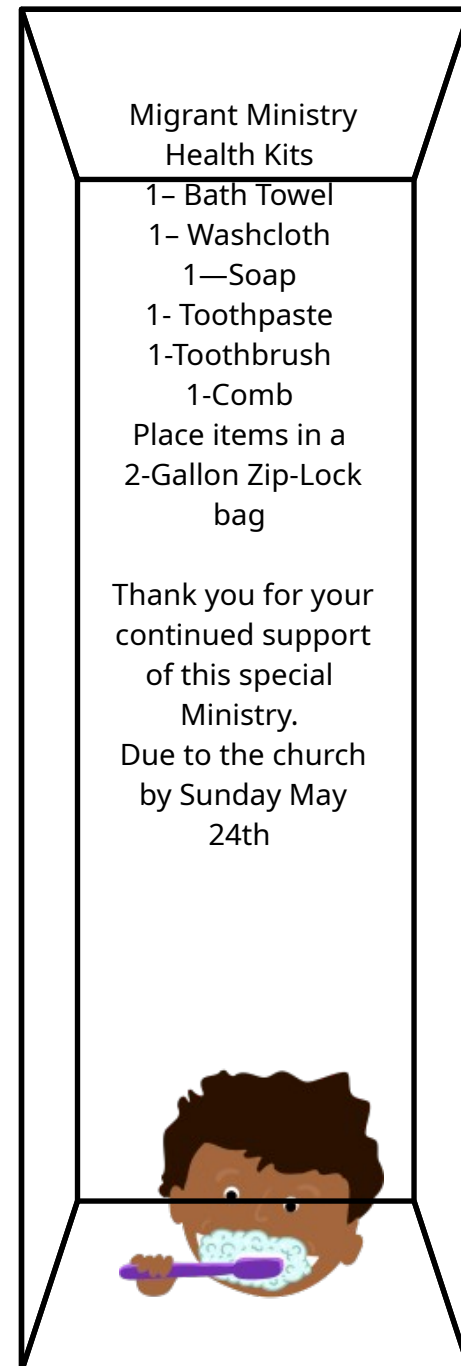

Good morning my church family, this is Gerald. My family and I have been members of Shell Point Baptist Church for the last 32 years. I have attended Sunday School and Church since I was six months old. We worshiped at Gillisonville Baptist Church, driving 32 miles one way to get there. We stayed there all day with our grandparents. I attended Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, Spring and Fall Revivals and other church activities and came to know the Lord at nine years old. We never missed Sunday School or Church as a family. My parents had strong belief that if you were alive on Sunday morning, you were in Sunday School. This proved to be true as I did not miss a Sunday for 18 consecutive years. I have the Perfect Attendance pins to prove it.
