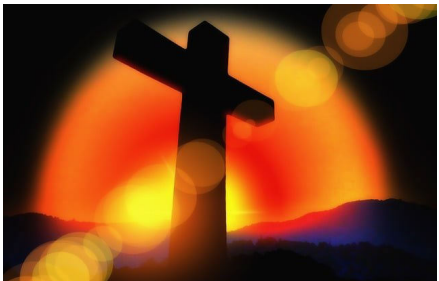

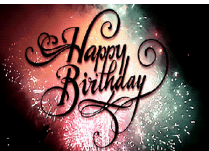
Remember you are special in the eyes of the Lord. He loves each of us so much that He sacrificed His only Son for our sins.
